• **Dr. Ruby Payne**

(Set 1) Do you have male students who shut down and refuse to work? More discipline referrals for males? 76% of K-12 educators are female but 50% of the student population are male. This session will provide deeper understandings of male brains and some of the strategies for better discipline results.

(Set 2) Why do students explode? This session will focus on unintegrated, unregulated brains and the calming strategies that can be used to have shorter and fewer emotional out of control episodes.



• **Dr. Courtney Gober – “How to Score the Most ‘Assists’ as an Assistant Principal”**

This session will examine the role of the assistant principal and how to maximize their impact on campus and student success. From being an effective leader/participant in PLCs and creating win-wins with difficult parents to giving students hi-fives in the hall and monitoring chicken nugget thievery in the lunch lines, the role of the assistant principal has evolved to be the “Jack or Jill of all trades.” Learn how to better manage your time, build capacity in yourself and others, and prepare yourself for your next steps by delivering the necessary “assists” to your campus, students, and principal. *Courtney Gober, Ed.D., has served as a teacher, assistant principal, principal, and now assistant superintendent for the last 18 years in both urban and suburban settings. • **Sean Cain – “The Power and Problems of Pacing: The Hardest, Easy School Improvement Strategy”**

Join former Texas educator and nationally recognized school improvement expert, Sean Cain, Lead Your School, in a practical discussion on instructional pacing. Improved instructional pacing is the most overlooked and under-appreciated school improvement strategy because of how difficult it is to accomplish for the unprepared. Unprepared, meaning every school administrator who does not attend this session.



• **Jacob Edwards, Safe & Civil Schools – “Foundations for a Proactive and Positive Learning Climate”**

This session will provide an overview of an effective leadership style as participants reflect on their current style. An overview of evidence-based strategies for leading effective and efficient school reform will also be explored. Objectives: to reflect on current leadership style; explore the characteristics of effective leadership; understand the concept of PBIS and the principles of behavior change; and be introduced to the STOIC Framework as a way to identify gaps in current systems. *Jacob Edwards began his career in education teaching chemistry and biology in the inner-city of Los Angeles. Fueled by the belief that all students deserve an equal and quality education, he began to broaden his impact as an educator. For over 12 years, he worked in a variety of secondary schools, serving as both a teacher and administrator in middle and high schools across a variety of socioeconomic contexts. Jacob’s most recent work was serving as a middle and high school building administrator with Green Dot Public Schools, a non-profit public charter management organization out of CA. He served as the founding principal for the first Green Dot Middle School in Watts, California and led the transformation efforts of the first Green Dot Middle School in Memphis, TN. During that time, he led the school-wide implementation of positive behavior supports for classrooms and individuals.*



• **Carrie Jackson – “Digital Leadership is Just Good Leadership”**

Let’s face it: “digital” is simply a part of our everyday lives. If we have not embraced digital tools for leading our schools, we are behind and had better catch up soon! Join us in a discussion of how assistant principals can and should use digital resources for leading schools, connecting with the community, networking and learning from others, assisting principals, and taking that next-level step in leadership. The future is NOW! *Carrie Jackson has served as a teacher, assistant principal, middle school principal, and now proudly serves Northwest HS in Northwest ISD as campus principal. In 2013, Carrie was recognized by NASSP as the Digital Principal of the Year! Carrie served as President of TASSP in 2017-2018. And this past summer, Carrie was a featured keynote speaker at NASSP’s Principal Conference in Chicago.*

She expertly files and responds to requests for, prepares witnesses and evidentiary materials for, and represents districts at due process hearings. She also consults with school personnel on special education and negotiates in mediation sessions. In addition to active representation, Jan provides pro-active training for both general education and special education administrators, teachers, and service providers on legal topics related to special education.
