Recording CPE Hours

Educators are required to keep a record of their professional development hours to meet the number of required hours for maintaining their certification. TEA suggests that educators keep a copy of attendance in a personal file in the event of an audit regarding certification. The Texas Association of Secondary School Principals approved provider number is 500-111. TASSP does not keep a copy of attendance by session at TASSP-sponsored workshops and conferences. On the TASSP Event App, there is a CPE form that attendees can use to record attendance by session, title, CPE Standards, and time. School counselors, learning resource specialists/librarians, educational diagnosticians, reading specialists, master teachers, superintendents, principals, and assistant principals must complete 200 clock hours every five years to maintain certification. 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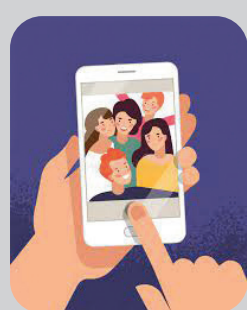

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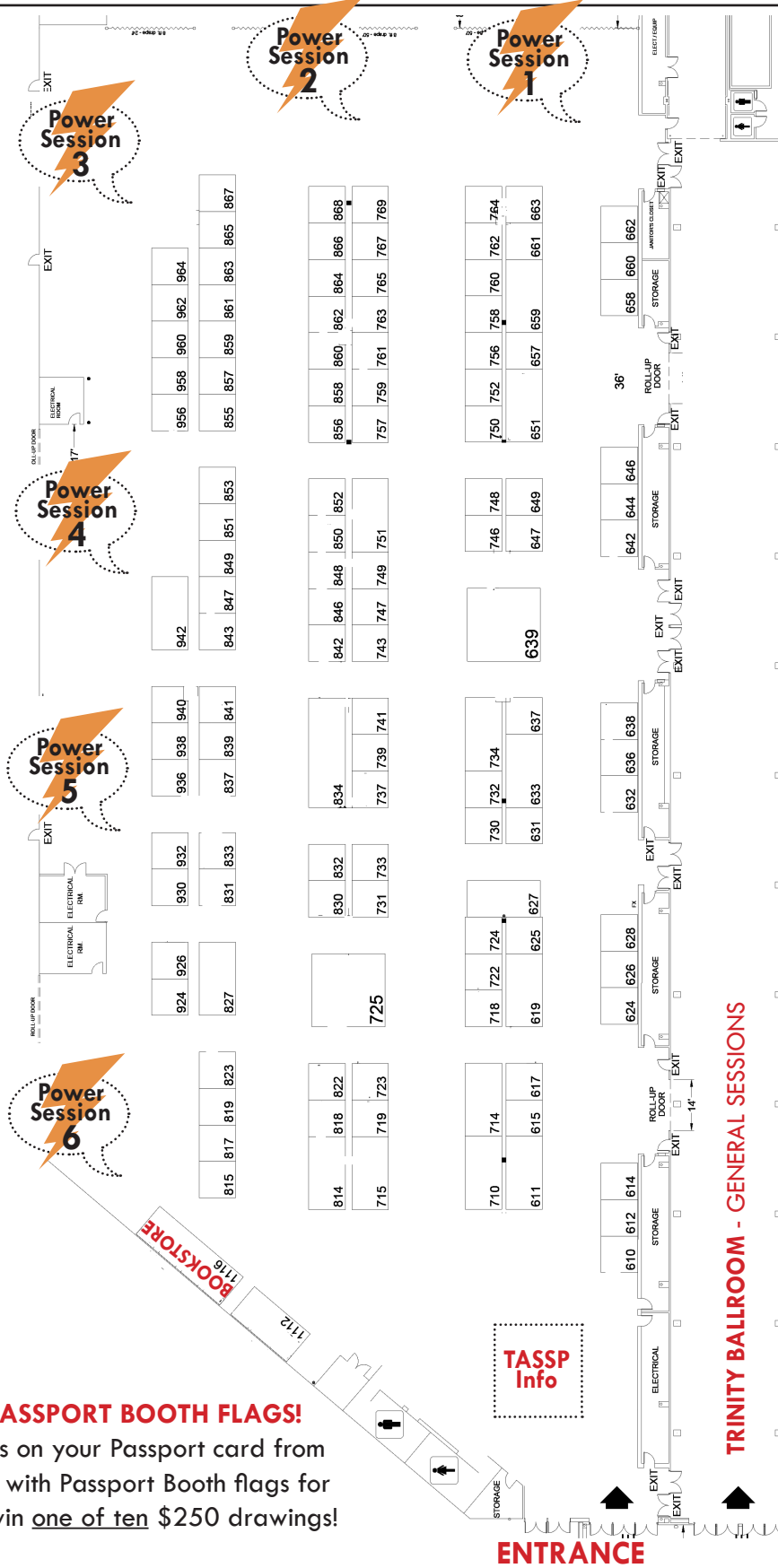

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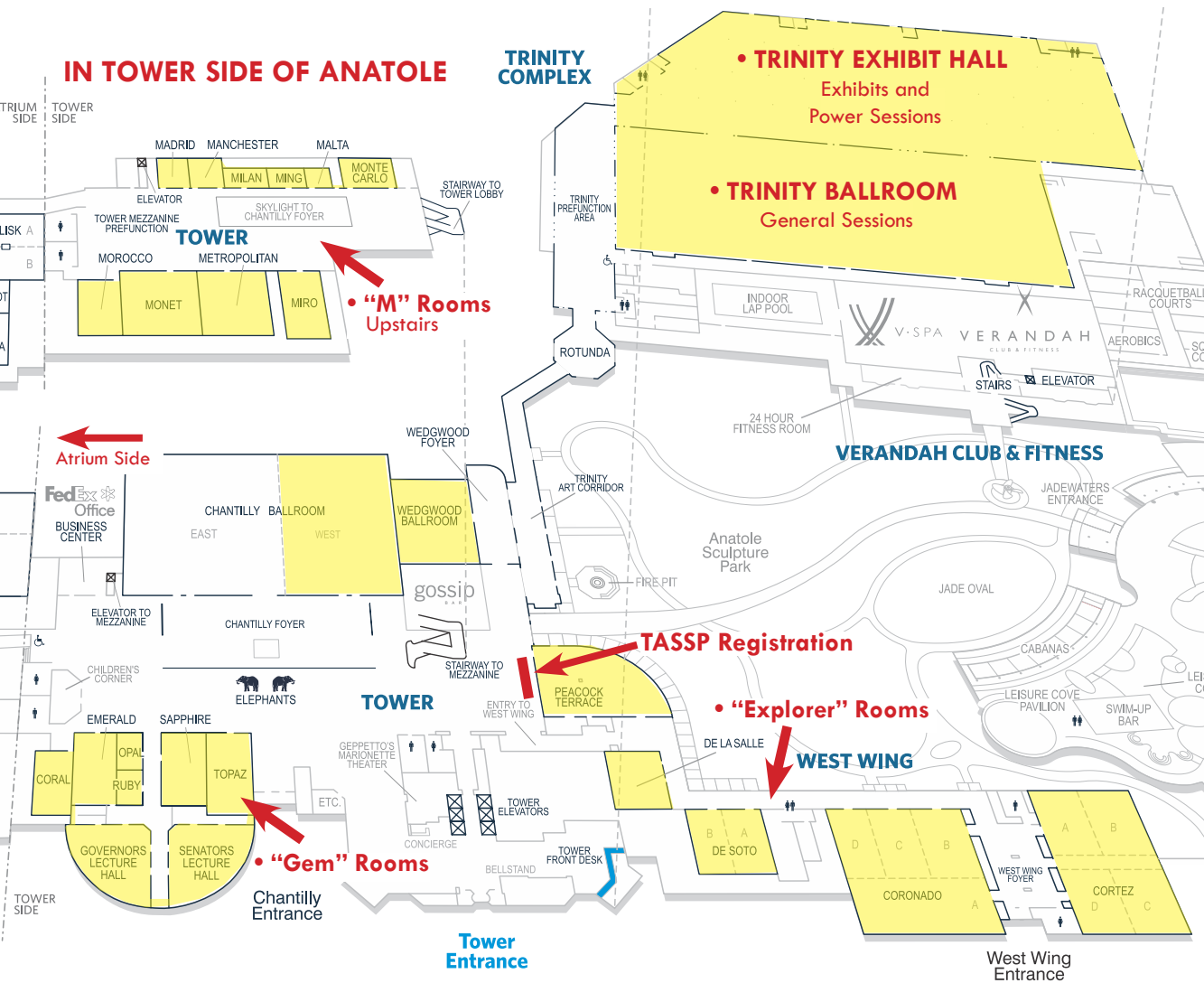
